Backgrounding Cattle on Grass this Summer

Thousands of calves and yearlings destined for the feedlot are spending their summer on pasture this year in Ontario. The goal of backgrounding cattle is to achieve adequate gain as well as frame growth in preparation for the feedlot. This article will focus on some tips for optimal success backgrounding cattle this season.

From a nutritional aspect, cattle on pasture should always be offered a vitamin and mineral supplement to ensure adequate nutrition for growth and development. Cattle on pasture can be difficult to deliver a mineral supplement to depending on the size and layout of the pasture. Due to this, a free choice pasture mineral is often the logical solution. Jones Feed Mills has specially formulated pasture minerals for exactly this purpose. PCM-BOV is medicated with Bovatec® as a way to regulate the rumen environment and also comes with garlic for aid in fly control in the summer months. The other, RANGEPRX, is unmedicated and serves the same purpose while being safe for mixed pastures. Either product should be offered free-choice in a mineral feeder near the water source and should be protected from rain.

Another option to supply vitamins and minerals along with energy and protein is to use a background pellet. Jones Feed Mills' 1600 products are a line of complete grower pellets suited to background cattle. They come plain or medicated with monensin and contain all required vitamins and minerals along with protein and energy for growth and development on pasture. The 1600 products are formulated to be fed at 1% of body-weight and can help with pasture longevity in times of drought. Cattle offered a background pellet will consume less pasture than cattle only offered a pasture premix.

Other best practices for pasture cattle would include implementing some form of rotational grazing system to avoid over grazing. Rotational grazing allows for pasture to have a period of rest before cattle are allowed to graze the area again. This helps maintain the health of pasture and allows pasture ground to be significantly more productive.



A-Moozing Hints...

Looking to improve ventilation in your calf hutches? Try propping up the back of the hutch with a concrete block or piece of plastic

drainage pipe to allow more air flow. This simple trick has been shown to reduce temperature, carbon dioxide levels, and bacterial counts inside the hutch. Younger animals are at a higher risk of heat stress so it is important to keep them as cool as possible. Calves under heat stress will direct more energy to prevent overheating, and also consume less
