

EQUINE ELECTROLYTES

The JFM Nutrition Department reminds all equine owners and caretakers to be mindful of your horse's water consumption during the summer months. The hot humid weather we experience during this period will increase your horse's water requirements. Providing salt and electrolytes in the diet can stimulate your horse's thirst response and encourage adequate water consumption.

As well, when horses sweat excessively due to exercise or heat and humidity, they lose important nutrients (electrolytes), such as sodium, chloride, potassium, calcium, and magnesium. Feeding supplemental electrolytes helps to replenish these nutrients lost due to excessive sweating. A deficiency in these nutrients can lead to reduced exercise tolerance and muscle problems. Remember to stop by The Millers Stone to pickup some electrolytes for your equine companion.

IS IT DYSENTERY?

Late summer and fall are common times when dairy producers can see their cows scouring. It might be for a day, it might be for the better part of a week. What is causing this? The JFM Dairy Team recommends speaking with your veterinarian and your JFM dairy rep immediately upon detecting this to discuss causes and remedies. Symptoms of dysentery can include reduced feed intakes, dehydration, diarrhea, nasal discharge, reduction in milk production and others. Causes of dysentery can include stress (caused by calving, feed changes, environment), toxins, a virus etc. JFM will work with you and your veterinarian on solutions to reduce the to stabilize the situation to the get the cows back on track as quickly as possible.



A REMINDER FROM OUR BEEF NUTRITION TEAM

Summer time means breeding season for many of our cow-calf producers.

A reminder from your JFM nutrition team to make sure your cows have access to a high quality, complete mineral supplement. Trace minerals play a large role in the reproductive health of cattle and help to ensure optimal reproductive success.

Additionally, as cattle continue to graze pastures, a reminder of the importance of pasture minerals. Pasture minerals help to ensure optimal growth, maintenance and reproductive performance in pastured cattle.

The JFM nutrition team would also like to emphasize the importance of good bunk management during warmer weather. Warm weather depresses feed intake, so ensuring cattle have consistent access to feed will minimize average daily gain losses. Summer time also means that hay, haylage and balage season is well underway. Good forage quality is key in any successful beef operation, so be sure to reach out to your JFM beef team with any questions regarding making good quality forages this season. Finally, as flies continue buzzing around the barns and pastures be sure to inquire about adding garlic to your mineral, supplements or complete feeds for fly control this summer.
