





2018 Corn Harvest Toxin Update! A

As many are aware, the 2018 corn crop has high incidence rates of mycotoxins, depending on the area. To update you, JFM continues to take all precautions to avoid using high vomitoxin corn and corn-influenced ingredients in our feeds. The JFM Nutrition Department encourages all producers to test all on-farm corn influenced ingredients (corn silage, dry and high moisture corn etc) for toxins and to work with their JFM Sales Consultant to devise a plan to manage the presence of any toxins in their feed or ingredients. Further, it is recommended that when handling high toxin feeds, that you do so in well ventilated areas. Below is an OMAFRA chart outlining the concern and effect levels of various toxins. Talk to your JFM Sales Consultant to learn more.

Mycotoxin	Concern Level (ppm)	Harmful Cattle (ppm)	Harmful Swine (ppm)
DON/Vomitoxin	0.56	2.5 to 6.0	0.6 to 1.0
Zearalenone	0.56	3.9 to 7.0	0.6 to 3.9
T-2	0.25	0.7 to 1.5	0.7 to 1.5
HT-2	0.25	1.5 to 3.0	1.5 to 3.0

Antimicrobial Update – Health Canada As of December 1, 2018, antimicrobials will no longer be sold at livestock medicine outlets. You will require a veterinary prescription to purchase any product containing antimicrobial ingredients. Note, ionophores and coccidiostats will not be affected. Talk to your JFM Rep to learn more.
