## **Reducing Beef Ration Costs with Good Communication**

In the high-cost commodity market that we are currently facing ration cost/head/day is at the forefront of producer's minds. Reducing these costs can become a challenge, but with good communication between producer and feed rep, adjustments can be made. When purchasing feed ingredients, on-farm we encourage you to first seek the advice of your feed rep and secondly, communicate those costs. If your feed rep is aware of your commodity costs, it is easier to formulate a more economical ration.

Situations can arise where a certain commodity becomes more attractive to purchase. We will use wet distillers grains as an example here. When the facilities that produce distillers lose the ability to dry wet distillers down for some reason or another, they often aggressively price the wet product to get it moved. In this situation if a producer is set up for this type of product, purchasing it for the reduced price and adjusting the ration can reduce your cost/head/day. In this scenario your fed rep would be able to help you determine if the price of wet distillers is attractive, if you are able to handle this product on farm and if feeding more wet distillers in place of other energy sources, such as corn, would further reduce feed costs.

Generally, distillers products have been more expensive than corn so we formulate rations to gain enough protein from distillers and get the majority of our energy from corn. However, when wet distillers become less expensive than corn on a dry matter basis, it is possible to push more protein and energy into the cattle from distillers and reduce the amount of corn fed. This would result in a lower cost, higher protein ration, but would achieve the same goals. The caveat is that by changing the makeup of the ration producers need to be aware of some nutrition and management considerations. Cattle fed more protein tend to have looser manure which can lead to wetter pens and the need for more bedding and/or barn clean outs.

#### Ration Costs, cont'd...

Feeding more distillers can

also increase the amount of phosphorus the cattle are consuming so adjusting the ration for higher calcium is often a good idea to prevent urinary calculi. Distillers are also high in sulfur so keeping an eye on that and managing to avoid sulfur toxicity, especially in high concentrate diets is also important.



The moral of the story here is that communication with your feed reps who are constantly aware of the commodity market as well as sound nutrition can help you to take advantage of and effectively manage more aggressively priced commodities. Reach out and take advantage of their valuable knowledge.


