Garlic for Fly Control 🚿

By Murray Scholl, JFM Beef Sales Consultant Garlic can be an effective, natural method for possible fly reduction in cattle, as the odor emitted through their skin and breath after consuming garlic may deter flies.

How it works:

When cattle ingest garlic, the strong-smelling compounds are metabolized and released through their sweat glands, creating an odor that flies find unappealing and therefore, they may be less likely to land on or bite the cattle.

Effectiveness:

Studies have suggested that supplementing cattle feed with garlic powder may significantly reduce fly populations, with one study finding a reduction of almost 50% compared to control groups. (Durunna and Lardner Dec 2020)

Implementation:

Mineral mixes: Garlic powder can be added to mineral mixes to ensure consistent intake.

Timing: For the best results, include garlic in the mineral mix 30 days before fly season starts and 30 days after it ends. **Potential Benefits:**

Natural and eco-friendly: Garlic is a natural and environmentally friendly alternative to chemical fly control methods.

Improved animal health: Reducing fly populations can lead to healthier and more comfortable cattle, as flies can cause irritation, stress, and potentially transmit diseases.

Improved temperament: Cattle that are not bothered by flies are generally calmer and easier to handle.

While garlic supplementation in cattle may offer some potential benefits for fly prevention, there's no evidence to suggest that garlic residues are present in cattle meat.
